



acknowledge those who have helped bring the project to life.

"This is a great way for businesses, individuals and families to be recognized for their commitment to what I believe is the most exciting waterfront project Burlington has seen," added John, noting all donors will be invited to a private unveiling when the wall is completed.

The expansion project has added 14,000 square feet of exhibition space on the street level, with an elevator that carries visitors to the rooftop greenspace alongside the Joseph Brant house sitting high overlooking the lakefront.

The project goal was to create a state-of-theart museum space where local artifacts can be displayed to tell the story of Burlington. The space is also designed to attract worldclass traveling exhibits which could not be housed in the original museum.

Burlington Mayor Marianne Meed Ward, who cut the ribbon on opening day along with Burlington Museums Board Chair Larry Waldron, said construction of the museum is a testament to the many people who worked hard over many years to make it happen. "It really did take a whole city working together to create what we are seeing today."
